

## The Future of nformd.on.sexual.assault

We are always looking forward to the next step for nformd.on.sexual.assault. We will continue to strive to make our program a powerful and integrated element of your campus.

### For the 2007-2008 Academic Year:

- **Continuing Communication:** In addition to viewing the initial video, students will have continued access to the nformd.net website and program for their entire college career. Furthermore, we will generate follow-up emails for students over their time at college. These emails will offer reminders of the information they received in the program, as well as new information concerning sexual assault safety.
- **Supplementary Resources:** Free with our program will come additional resources for faculty, staff, and peer educators who want to build off of nformd.on.sexual.assault content. Presently these will include discussion prompts and additional readings, as well as discipline-specific lessons on the issue. In the future, we envision supplementary video modules exclusive for classroom/workshop use.
- **Free for Faculty:** In the interest of cultivating as much awareness as we can on campuses, we intend to make nformd.on.sexual.assault free for all the faculty of any institution that purchases the program for its incoming student body.
- **Release of Data:** We believe it essential that other researchers have access to aggregate data from nformd.on.sexual.assault so that we can contribute to the academic community and so that we all can learn as much about the issue as possible. Knowledge is meant to be shared.

### Expected for the 2008-2009 Academic Year:

- **Same-sex Sexual Assault Module:** While we could not address this issue in the present version, we are sensitive to its importance, especially since sexual assault occurs at the same frequency in same-sex circles as heterosexual circles. Future versions of our program will include an optional module just on this topic that speaks to the unique elements of same-sex sexual assault, such as the gender roles and why the stigma of same-sex assault can make it more difficult to report.
- **Spanish Language Version:** Recognizing the importance of reaching the large Spanish speaking population in the U.S. and abroad, we will be producing a Spanish language version of the program.
- **Ethnic-Specific Modules:** We already have been asked by some historically African-American institutions to produce optional modules that speak to issues specific to their culture, and we envision similar modules for Latino, religious, and other cultures.
- **Supplementary Modules:** One of the great ways we plan on expanding program content is by offering optional modules for those students interested in the issue. For example, students interested in bystander intervention could click a link at the end of the mandatory section that would take them to additional modules on the topic.
